Here are the most recent students who came to Lorma:

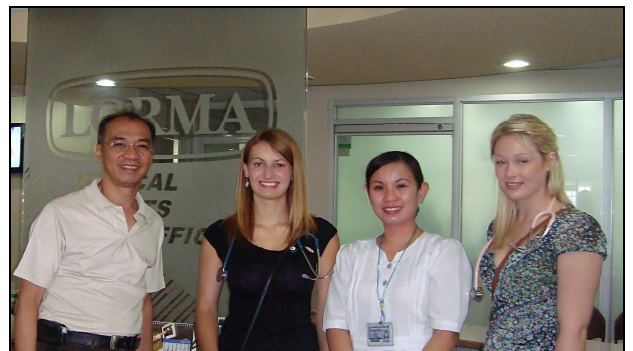
